Often times, after clear aligner therapy, the patient is left dissatisfied with the worn and chipped incisal edges of the upper anterior teeth once their teeth are in the correct functional position.

A conservative, enamel preserving and methodical method of composite bonding can result in excellent esthetic results. I will show cases of worn incisal edges post clear aligner therapy and clinical tips on how to perform composite bonding in a step by step approach. The techniques will help the clinician with composite shade selection and bonding protocols. Lastly, shaping, contouring and polishing the composite will be demonstrated.

Patients come into our office with misaligned, chipped or discolored teeth. However, due to social media, patients are more fearful of "drilling" on their teeth. Therefore, they become very apprehensive to treatment.

It is crucial to educate and communicate to our patients and use a more conservative approach to enhancing their smile. Step one is aligning the teeth into the correct position in order to have long term results with composite bonding.

Step two is assessing where and how much is needed to enhance the newly positioned teeth to create a more esthetic result. Composite bonding can be as minimal as an incisal chip to transforming teeth with composite veneers

Pre Restorative Orthodontics for Minimal Prep to Maximum Results

With the use of the latest digital tools, materials, and techniques, it is possible for Dentists to help a significant number of patients achieve their stated goals of improving their smiles using minimally invasive treatments with ceramic veneers. Cosmetic treatment in the anterior region often involves the placement of porcelain veneers using conventional approaches that remove healthy tooth structure in order to achieve highly esthetic outcomes. Although conventional approaches to porcelain veneer treatment are still prescribed for the majority of the patients who receive cosmetic care, improvements in restorative materials and the development of conservative techniques allow clinicians to deliver highly esthetic outcomes using minimally invasive or nopreparation veneers in cases in which clear aligner therapy is used to correct a deep bite and straighten misaligned teeth, esthetics can be successfully achieved with conservative

techniques in cases involving underlying factors such as Class I deep bite malocclusion with proper case selection and occlusal management.

Starting with a clear vision for esthetic cases allows for the seamless development and execution of a treatment plan. Esthetic tooth wear, whether caused by functional or chemical factors, can be addressed through clear aligner therapy or by tackling the underlying chemical issue. Success in planning esthetics relies on choosing restorations that ensure long-term success. Photography is crucial for effective communication with ceramists in indirect restorations and plays a vital role in evaluating direct composite cases and aiding in shade selection. Team members contribute to the communication process. Completing a checklist brings the esthetic vision of your patient's teeth to reality.

- 1. Develop and understand the importance of having a clear vision for esthetic cases
- 2. Identify and address causes of esthetic wear on teeth
- 3. Correct esthetic issues with clear aligner therapy or chemical factor resolution
- 4. Select restorations for long-term esthetic success
- 5. Utilize photography in communication and evaluation for effective esthetic planning
- 6. Engage team members in the communication process for collaborative esthetic planning
